A common phenomenon observed amongst the retired elderly is that they lack a sense of purpose in life, which has said to be an indirect cause of mental disorders such as Alzheimer's disease	Inheritance (全城傳承) is an online platform that allows the elderly to browse and choose activities or workshops offered by an array of partner organizations, such as NGOs, SEs, and elderly service providers, aiming to give them a sense of purpose after retirement. Furthermore, the elderly can share their stories and experiences with the general public through the platform, allowing them to forge their self-identities.
